Health literacy is a concept that can be widely embraced by schools. Schools can contribute to the achievement of public health goals in conjunction with their educational commitments.

Facilitating Curriculum Change through TEKS Alignment

Middle School Focus

- Students learn about health behaviors that will safeguard their health as well as information related to understanding puberty and the reproductive process.
- Students are taught about factors in their environment that impact, not only their health and the health of their families, but the health of their communities as well.
- Students learn to refine their critical-thinking skills to avoid unsafe situations, analyze health information and products, and maintain healthy relationships.
- Students begin to investigate health in the broader context of community.

High School Focus

- Students develop skills that will make them health-literate adults.
- Students gain a deeper understanding of the knowledge and behaviors they use to safeguard their health, particularly pertaining to health risks.
- Students are taught how to access accurate information that they can use to promote health for themselves and others.
- Students use problem-solving, research, goalsetting and communication skills to protect their health and that of the community.

What should schools be teaching about Cervical Cancer and HPV?

- Analyze health information necessary to make informed decisions as related to disease prevention
- Promote the importance of annual exams and medical care
- Stress the consequences associated with sexual health behaviors
- Create Cervical Cancer and HPV Awareness opportunities

Recommendations

- Evaluate current curriculum to determine where to embed cervical cancer and HPV education
- Collaborate with school districts to help integrate Cervical Cancer and HPV education into existing curriculum
- Ensure that curriculum addresses both male and female issue associated with HPV

Recommendations

- Develop strategies to educate participants in schoolbased pregnancy prevention programs or related services
- Establish a support structure to assist schools with necessary resources such as guest speakers and training/professional development
- Utilize district School Health Advisory Councils (SHAC) for support and recommendations to school board
