





Estimated Smoking Costs, 2009

- Total Annual Costs of Smoking in Travis County
 - → Over \$460 million each year
 - Direct Health Care Costs for Travis County \$305 million
 - Loss of future earnings and productivity of \$155.5 million
- Employees who take four 10 minute breaks throughout the day to use tobacco, work one month less per year than workers who don't take those breaks.

Tobacco-Related Litter



- o Waterloo Park: collected and flagged over 4400 cigarette butts in < 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours
- 32 parks: 60% of all litter was tobacco-related (over 23,000 pieces)
- so San Francisco study (2009)
 - Direct costs of clean-up of tobacco product litter are over \$6M annually
- National study (2009)
 - Cigarette butts were #1 littered item
 - 38% of litter was tobacco-related
- years for one cigarette butt to degrade.

Fire Safety

- Matches and cigarettes account for 21% of outdoor fires
- In Austin, smoking causes 25% of fire-related deaths and is the number 1 cause of fire-related deaths.

Electronic Cigarettes

- **So Unregulated**
- Marketed to children (i.e. cotton candy, bubble gum flavors)
- **So Complicates enforcement**
- Might promote dual-use
- no proof of assistance with cessation
- Some studies have shown presence of carcinogens & other toxic substances


Measuring Air Quality

⁵⁰ Cigarettes, cigars and pipes are major emitters of respirable suspended particles less than 2.5 microns (PM_{2.5}) in diameter that are easily inhaled deep into the lungs



- TSI SidePak AM510 Personal Aerosol Monitor (weight: 1 lb)
- This instrument measures and records in memory the PM_{2.5} concentration every minute during sampling
- PM_{2.5} very sensitive marker of SHS







Austin Foundation Communities <u>Affordable Housing Example</u>

Clean duct work due to smoke	\$162
Paint fridge due to smoke and yellowing	\$75
Cleaning needed	\$100
Kilz unit for heavy smoke odor	\$146
Replace 5 sets of blinds die to yellowing and smoke odor	\$100
Replace both ceiling fans due to yellowing and smoke odor	\$152
Replace carpet due to smoke and pet damage Replace vent hood and dining room light due to	\$212
yellowing/smoke	\$91
Replace vinyl due to extreme smoke/stains	\$920
Resurface kitchen counter-large cigarette burn/odor	\$75
Scrub and paint kitchen cabinets due to nicotine absorption	\$80

Cigarette-Related Fire Risks in Austin MUH

\$\inp 2008-2013:

- Every year, on average, smoking-related fires result in \$2 million of financial losses
- 90% of fires caused by smoking materials occurred in residential properties.
- 67% of all structural fires caused by smoking materials had a financial loss.
- The 5-year average cost per a fire caused by smoking materials was \$32,317.

Business & Worksite Strategies



What is a tobacco-free worksite?

- Employees, vendors, visitors and clients MAY NOT use tobacco at any time on the premises of the designated properties, including all buildings, parking lots (including personal vehicles. City of Austin vehicles parked in the lots), and any of the locations' grounds.
- **Definition of tobacco products:**
 - Tobacco products identified as including cigarettes, cigars, chewing tobacco, snuff, pipes, snus electronic smoking devices and any non-FDA approved nicotine delivery devices

2011 COA Employee Survey Results

Universities General Lessons Learned

- not sometimes Top down approach is most effective
- Student government not an effective strategy







